CHOPS Central Heating Oil Purchasing Scheme is a simple organisation designed to save us all some money on our central heating oil. I collect orders about 6 times a year. On my buying day, I get the best price possible and advise everyone where the oil is coming from and the current price. The saving comes from the bulk delivery into the village which normally means at least one full tanker load and 25+ deliveries. Payment depends on the supplier, but the worst scenario is that they phone for a debit card prior to delivery (they all charge a premium for Credit Cards). I do not handle any payment and have no vested interest in any oil company. If you run out of oil between deliveries, you can make your own arrangements and I am not in the least bit offended. The whole enterprise is 100% above board and I make or gain nothing from running CHOPS (apart from a few headaches usually related to deliveries!) If you want to 'join' just let me have name, address and post code as well as your phone number and I will add you to my list. Please note the minimum oil delivery is 500 litres (as designated by the oil suppliers). You will find forward delivery dates and other information in the Linkup. 




GOOD COMPANIONS

NOTE FROM A SMALL PARISH

Clerk to Council

This month's meeting opened with the introduction of the new temporary clerk, Jayne Nelson, who has agreed to take on the role initially for 3 months until we find a full time replacement. Jayne has a background in accounts and is currently clerk to a board of school governors but hasn't been a clerk to a parish council before. She is very enthusiastic but there will be challenges for her and we will support her as much as we can. Welcome to the PC, Jayne, we hope you enjoy it as much as we do.

Public Forum

As is normal the meeting started with the public forum. There was a complaint that there was a lot of noise coming from the chapel on the High Street on the Sunday evening prior to the meeting. However because it was a particularly very warm evening the doors of the chapel were wide open and that may have accounted for the rise in volume. The PC has noted the comment and will continue to monitor the situation.

Highways Matters/Potholes

I was about to announce that the new pothole reporting system was eventually working (the two potholes in the High St had finally been filled) only to find that the roadside crumbling on Newark Road (aka Newton's Lane) had been filled with crushed limestone. Now I remember questioning this particular temporary filling when it was used at the top of Station Road a few years ago. I was told that it was indeed just a temporary fill but had shown good holding and drainage properties and lasted longer that other temporary fills especially on road edgings. Well, I know that Highways have had their budget cut but how long should a temporary repair last until it is fixed with a permanent repair?

Footpaths

Cllr Ketteringham had been told by a concerned parishioner that the footpath between Station Road and Bulpitt Lane had become overgrown. Prior to this though we had received notification from NKDC of an impending footpath cutting schedule and that was passed on. However, I seemed to remember we had a report some years ago from the local ramblers association complaining about the same thing. I have dug out the old e-mail and and maps of the footpath routes and passed them on to Cllr Lloyd who is looking to co-ordinate all the grass cutting of public areas in the village.

Parking at the school

You will remember from last month's meeting that Cllr Carter said the school writes a letter to each parent/carer at the start of every term. That letter always contains a paragraph regarding inconsiderate parking at the school. She has sent this to the PC and we have copied it here verbatim. "The age old problem surrounding parking is still with us, so once again, can we please ask, that parents driving to school to park with consideration for others and in particular, regard for the safety of the children who are walking. Please also be mindful of parking in Station Road, particularly on the corner and across resident's driveways. We have had complaints from local residents. The same request has also been made to playgroup. At all times, please do not block the bus stop. Please remember that there is the 'Park and Stride' available from the village hall." So there you have it, the school are aware of the problem and are actively making parents/carers aware of it too.

Speed signs

Some time ago we completed a survey asking us where we would like some speeding signs put around the village. The survey was sent off and we requested (AND paid for...) a number of signs but have heard nothing in the meantime. I was tasked to contact the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership and find out where our signs are. UPDATE Well, I contacted them and they arrived the next day. Woohoo, expect to see them going up in the village over the next few weeks. (See also the photo of Bob proudly displaying a sign)

Our contact at Highways hasn't got back to us yet reference the heights, fonts, etc. of the new signs so I was again tasked to speak to them to find out what was happening - (if only she replied as fast as speed signs guys did...)

Purchase of new laptop and printer for the new Parish Clerk

It has been some time since we updated our steam powered IT system. The old computer had a clockwork operated hard drive and the old printer was a basic inkjet that didn't have any scanning or copying facilities so if anything needed copying, Lesley had to take it to the post office or the co-op thereby incurring more costs to the PC. Well, after a grant from central funding we are getting a new super shiny laptop and 3-in-1 printer for our replacement clerk. (Doesn't that alone want to make you want to apply for the job? No? Sure?)

Hedge Cutting, Pacey Close

This wasn't really an item for the agenda, more of an FYI really. Both Cllr Lloyd and myself had received comments about the hedge on the corner of Pacey Close and the High Street. It was a bit overgrown and was partially obstructing the view up the High Street. I asked the lady who phoned me if she had mentioned it to the person who owned the hedge. She said she hadn't as she had been working and hadn't seen them at home. Anyway, I happened to be cycling past one day and saw the car in the driveway so I popped in. I mentioned the hedge and the gentleman at the property said that he had been working his way round but would make that particular corner his immediate priority. Two days later and job's a good'un. Thank you.

THE MAIL FIELD –A CONVERSATION WITH BILL PACEY

This article appears as a result of a conversation between Geoff Lloyd and Bill Pacey who, as you will see, has lived in Swinderby since 1929. We have included the photos mentioned in the article as well as Poplar Farm as it was in the late '50s, and , overleaf, how it looks now. You can also see Hurst Farm nowadays.

In 1929, when Bill was aged 4, he moved with his elder sister Mary and their parents to Swinderby from Norton Disney and in November of that year sister Joyce was born. One reason they moved was to make life easier for the family because at that time children from Norton Disney attended All Saints School, Swinderby.

In 1929, the nature of farming was totally different when compared to today. Farms were much smaller and didn't specialise and therefore the Paceys, as with so many others, grew crops, for example cereals and sugar beet and kept cattle, horses, chickens, pigs and, later on, sheep. The land they farmed was owned by a local landowner, a Mr L Curtis of Collingham and although Poplar Farm where they lived was in the village they farmed, with many others the plethora of small fields surrounding Swinderby.

Bill recalls, from those early days in the village, a field named the Mail Field by the villagers as a result of an accident which happened on the 6th June1926. It involved the mail train travelling from Lincoln to Tamworth and having just passed South Scarle crossing it became derailed. Eight Post Office workers and nine passengers were injured and taken to Nottingham hospital where unfortunately one subsequently died. You can imagine the interest the accident would have generated in the village and, perhaps because mail was being sorted on some of the coaches, it littered the field following the derailment. A Colonel Pringle produced a detailed report for the Ministry of Transport. It included the photographs accompanying this article (*see inside pages*) showing three constables guarding the train and a driver or fireman, possibly from the breakdown train, posing alongside the derailed engine.,

For Swinderby, as elsewhere, life on the land would have continued with very little change throughout the 1930s. Approximately 20 small farms, farming land from around 12 to 100 acres, being associated with Swinderby and the local area. With the outbreak of war change was on its way and Bill recalls land army girls helping on the farms, including working for his Uncle Eddie who lived at Hurst Farm, on High Street, and delivered milk locally. Around this time the first tractors arrived in Swinderby and hence farmers became less dependent on horses or stationary steam engines to plough the fields. Not every farmer was able to afford a tractor but it was possible to hire one should the need arise.


The war highlighted the need for the country to become even more self sufficient in terms of food production and during the 1940s and 50s farming, driven by the new technologies and science, was changing.

The pace of change was ever increasing and for the village 1958 was a key year because the Swinderby and Eagle Hall estate, owned by Mr Curtis, was sold. Henry Spencer and Sons, of Retford were the agents and the estate covered roughly 2,566 acres. At that time the estate generated an income of £4,674 per an-

num. Following the private sale of two large blocks of land, the purchase of several smaller plots by the tenant farmers and sales at an auction the estate realised approximately £90,000. Only a small acreage remained unsold. As a consequence of the change in ownership of the land many more smaller fields and hedges including, perhaps, the Mail Field, would have disappeared.

Bill continued to farm and live at Poplar Farm, (11 High Street) with his family, the land now being owned by a Mr Colton. In 1973 the land was sold yet again this time to John Gagg and for a short period Bill worked for other farmers and farmed 23 acres near the station. However, in 1976 he went to work at Morton Hall Prison. He and Joyce have continued to live in the village and contribute significantly to village life

Swinderby All Saints Primary School is indeed a tardis, containing amazing hidden gems inside. When one first comes across the school, nestled happily between the church and a few houses, one can be forgiven for thinking that there is little to it apart from the quaint façade with the old school bell above it. However, for those who venture inside its fantastic secrets can be discovered and the sheer amount of facilities it has can be appreciated. The modern entrance hall leads both to a spacious hall with staffroom and resources areas. The central corridor then leads off to busy and vibrant classrooms on the ground floor – catering for the needs of the KS1 children. There is a music room with a wide selection of instruments all waiting to be played. The adjacent ICT Suite offers the latest technology.

The staircase leads to the stimulating KS2 classrooms where further learning takes place preparing them for the world beyond the school.

The final jewel in the crown is the vast and well used outside area. There the tarmac playground gives way to the outdoor climbing equipment with its enticing selection of climbing frames and challenging apparatus. Next to the running track and rounders area sits the Peace Garden with its quiet spaces waiting for moments of contemplation. There are murals there; created by the children, which serve as reminders to those from the First World War. Then there are the vegetable growing beds and the fruit cages where children come weekly to tend the produce growing there. At the top end of the field sits the wildlife area, where children can collect minibeasts whilst near to it the children can play on the multi surface sports pitch in all weathers.
